Opening Plenary: There is a Dream that We Dream, How the World Should Be
Patty Wetterling, U.S. advocate of children's safety

Twenty years after 11-year old Jacob Wetterling was abducted at gunpoint on a rural St. Joseph, MN road his family has not given up hope. Oct. 22, 1989 a masked gunman approached Jacob, his brother and their friend as they road their bikes home from the store. He took Jacob and ordered the other two to get down. Despite a massive manhunt and hundreds of leads, Jacob has never been found. Patty, established the first state sex offender registry back in 1994. Patty and her husband, Jerry, co-founded the Jacob Wetterling Resource Center.

DAY ONE: The School Shooting at Aplington-Parkersburg High School and Murder of Coach Ed Thomas



Ed Thomas (July 17, 1950 – June 24, 2009) was the high school football coach for Aplington-Parkersburg High School in Parkersburg, Iowa. On Wednesday, June 24, 2009, Mark Becker, former student and football player, shot Thomas at least six times in the high school weight room then kicked Thomas’ body before walking away. More than 20 high school students in the football team’s weight room witnessed the shooting death of coach Ed Thomas.

Thomas had coached 37 years of Aplington-Parkersburg Falcon football and won two state titles and a total of 292 games. He is credited with having coached four current NFL players, which is the most per capita of any high school in the nation. The current NFL players he coached while coaching at Aplington-Parkersburg include Aaron Kampman (Jacksonville Jaguars), Brad Meester (Jacksonville Jaguars), Jared DeVries (Detroit Lions), and Casey Wiegmann (Denver Broncos). Landon Schrage was signed in 2006 as a long snapper for the Baltimore Ravens, making him the 5th player under Coach Thomas to reach the NFL. In 2005, Thomas won the prestigious NFL High School Coach of the Year award.
