### Plenary Speakers



**SUE ELSE, PRESIDENT,**  
National Network to End  
Domestic Violence

As President of the National Network to End Domestic Violence (NNEDV), Sue Else provides extensive leadership and coordination within the domestic violence movement in the United States, and ensures that the voices of battered women are represented at the national level. Ms. Else started her career in the domestic violence movement more than 25 years ago as a volunteer for a battered women's shelter in Ames, Iowa, where she also served as both the Volunteer Coordinator and the Executive Director. In 1987, Ms. Else was hired as the President of Hope House, a domestic violence organization in Kansas City, Missouri. Under Ms. Else's leadership, Hope House grew from a \$260,000 budget with 13 staff members to a \$3.5 million budget with more than 70 staff members. During her career, Ms. Else has served as a leader in local, state, national and international violence against women initiatives, including assisting with the creation of a domestic violence hotline in the Slovak Republic in Central Europe. She has also received numerous accolades for her work to empower women, including the Sunshine Peace Award.



**CHIEF JOHN GUARD,**  
Pitt County Sheriff's Office

Chief John Guard has devoted the majority of his professional career to holding abusers accountable for their violence. He started the Domestic Violence Unit in the Pitt County Sheriff's Office in 1997 and has been a tireless advocate for battered women ever since. Chief Guard has been a leader in our state in working with legislators to improve victim safety and to establish new laws to hold offenders more accountable. Chief Guard

travels all over the state and the country educating law enforcement officers and allies on how to work with victims of abuse. He is on the training faculty of the National College of District Attorneys and is a recurring presenter at their annual domestic violence conference. Chief Guard serves on numerous local and statewide committees that address domestic violence, including the NC Domestic Violence Commission and the Pitt County DV Task Force. He is committed to public service and generously gives his time on community and statewide boards, including the NC Victims Assistance Network Board of Directors as President-Elect. Chief Guard received the 2009 RBC Bank/Verizon Wireless Men for Change Award from NCCADV for his work to end violence against women.



**TONY PORTER, CO-FOUNDER,**  
A Call to Men

Tony Porter is an educator and activist who has been working in the social justice arena for over twenty years. He is nationally recognized for his effort to end men's violence against women. Tony is the original visionary and co-founder behind A CALL TO MEN: The National Association of Men and Women Committed to Ending Violence Against Women. He is the author of "Well Meaning Men...*Breaking Out of the Man Box - Ending Violence Against Women.*" An engaging and sought after lecturer, Tony's message of accountability is welcome and supported by many grassroots and established organizations. He is currently working with numerous domestic and sexual violence programs, the National Football League, the National Basketball Association, colleges and universities around the country. He has worked with the United States Military Academy at West Point and the United States Naval Academy at Annapolis. In addition, he has been a guest presenter for the United Nations' Commission on the Status of Women.
